Horn reform: In Cambodia, if you install a musical horn in your vehicle, you will be in trouble. The prime minister has ordered police across the country to enforce an order that car owners replace musical horns with normal horns. The leader had seen videos on social media of "inappropriate activity" associated with the musical horns, such as people, especially children and youth, dancing on the roads and roadsides as passing vehicles play tunes, creating a serious safety hazard. He has mandated that any musical horn should be ripped out and replaced with the standard honking kind. While this new law may take away some music from the streets, it aims to significantly improve road safety.



Recipe of the

Black Bean Breakfast Bowl

2 tablespoons olive oil 4 eggs, beaten 1/4 cup salsa 1 (15 ounce) can black beans, drained salt and ground black pepper

1 avocado, peeled and sliced 1/4 cup salsa

Heat olive oil in a small pan over medium heat. Cook and stir eggs until eggs are set, 3 to 5 minutes. Place black beans ina microwave-safe bowl. Heat on High in the microwave until warm, about 1 minute. Divide warmed black beans between two bowls.

Top each bowl with scrambled eggs, avocado, and salsa. Season with salt and black pepper.
